RE: REQUEST FOR CERTIFICATE OF "NO OBJECTION" TO ADOPT SELECTIVE TENDERING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF ACEDHARS CENTRE BUILDING

This is to refer to your unreferenced letter dated November 22, 2022, which requested for issuance of Due Process "No Objection" to adopt Selective Tendering Method of Procurement for the Construction of Africa Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) Centre Building at University of Lagos.

- 2. The University's letter under reference is as reproduced below:
 - a) Background: The Africa Center of Excellence (ACE 1) Project was instituted in 2013 by the Governments of Nigeria, Ghana, Benin Republic, Togo, Burkina Faso, Cameroun and Senegal with support from the World Bank, to promote regional specialization amongst participating universities in the West and Central Africa subregion within disciplines that address particular common regional challenges. However, the 2nd Africa Higher Education Center of Excellence (ACE IMPACT) Project was lunched to consolidate on the gains of ACE 1, and it saw the emergence of new players like Niger, Guinea and Togo (all from West Africa) and Djibouti (from East Africa). The objectives of ACE Impact included to improve on the quantity of students enrolled in postgraduate programmes and improve on the quality of postgraduate programmes such that students can acquire the necessary theoretical knowledge and applied skills upon graduating. The project also aimed at improving the development impact of postgraduate education in selected universities, through regional specification, such that the knowledge from research and skills acquired by graduates will be able to directly address the development challenges in the regions.
 - b) The Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) and the International Development Agency (IDA) of the World Bank (WB) entered into a credit agreement (Credit Number 6510NG) to finance the ACE Impact project. To implement the project, the Government of Nigeria has secured US\$115 million, with the World Bank contributing \$75 million and the French Development Agency (AFD) providing \$40 million for the 17 ACE Impact Centres and the NUC.
 - c) The National ACE Project Coordination Unit (NAPCU) domiciled at the National Universities Commission (NUC) is responsible for the national project facilitation, training, and supervision in fiduciary aspects as well as national Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) and minor Technical Assistance (TA) in Nigeria.
 - d) To this end, the Africa Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS), domiciled at the University of Lagos, Lagos State is responsible to build capacity within West

- e) World Bank Funded Project: 1\$ Equal to N431:- The World Bank had approved the sum of \$ 959,473 (N413, 532,863) for the Construction of ACEDHARS Centre Building. Furthermore, it is imperative to add that the World Bank will be coming for Mid Term review Visitation/Inspection and commissioning of the project in January, 2023 and it is expected that the Procurement Process for the Construction has commenced before
 - 2023 and it is expected that the Procurement Process for the Construction has commenced before the scheduled Visit. This also will enable the Centre commence teaching activities for the 2021/2022 batch of students admitted by the African Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) at the University.
- f) Justification for Selective Tendering:- Considering the essence of time in these procurement in which ifadvertised could cause delay and the fund could be taken back by the sponsor (World Bank) due to lack of fund utilization by the Centre, the University wishes to adopt the selective tendering method in engaging competent contractors to execute this project.
- g) Given the fact that the project is result based, hence money can only be earned when disbursement Link Indicators (DLIs) are met and achieved, the World Bank may decline further funding of the project if the Centre is not meeting the Disbursement Linked Indicators (DLI) for which the project was conceived. Therefore, it has become imperative to adopt the Selective Tendering procedure for the University to meet the DLI and in tine with the provision of Section 40 (b&C) of the Public Procurement Act 2007.
- h) Also, due to the Covid 19 Pandemic which has been ravaging the world over thus, gathering of persons and representatives of companies to the bid opening exercise would not be a good idea if we must avoid dose contact.
- i) Considering the time scheduled for the World Bank's Mid Term review visit in January, 2023 to the Centre, and the specialized nature of this procurement, adopting open competitive tendering at this point will be counter-productive to the center and may automatically lead to risk of withdrawing the money earmarked for this procurement by the World Bank. For these reasons, the University is appealing to you to use your good office to approve the adoption of selective tendering method for the Construction of ACEDHARS Centre building as an exception rather than the norm in line with the provision of Section 401(c) of the public procurement act 2007 using the original Equipment Manufacturer Authorized representatives.
- j) The Project will be funded from World Bank Support Fund. Attached is the Performance and Funding Agreement between the National Universities Commission and University of Lagos with funding from the International Development Association (IDA).
- k) Knowledge and Cognate Experience: It is imperative that competent firms with cognate experience and good track records are chosen. The shortlisted companiess are representatives of equipment manufacturers in Nigeria to be engaged to deliver in terms of quality and timing while also offering competitive price so as to obtain value for money. The University has identified some companies that have previous business with Federal Government of Nigeria, which provides the advantage of having

adequate knowledge of the assignment, and has proven speedy completion of the projects white ensuring quality. The companies that meet up with the requirement of the provisions of section 16(6)(d) of the PPA, 2007 that can do business with Federal Government of Nigeria to effectively carry out the implementation of these projects are as detailed below:

- i) Proposal and Profile: Please find attached profiles of the companies upon which Certificate of "No Objection "for Selective Tendering is sought alongside the following supporting documents for ease of reference:
 - Memorandum of Understanding between National Universities Commission (NUC) and Federal University of Lagos;
 - The Centre's approved and cleared work plan and procurement plan;
 - The Funding/Loan Agreement; and
 - Project Appraisal Document (PAD)
- 3. The Bureau has carefully reviewed the request of the University of Lagos and noted the following:
 - a) The University intends to adopt Selective Tendering Method of Procurement for the Construction of Africa Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHAR.S). The project was instituted with support from the World Bank, to promote regional specialization amongst participating Universities in the West and Central Africa sub-region within disciplines that address particular common regional challenges.
 - b) Other objectives of the project highlighted include improving the quantity and quality of students enrolled in postgraduate programmes such that students can acquire the necessary theoretical knowledge and applied skills upon graduating such that the skills acquired will be used to address the development challenges in the regions.
 - c) The FGN and the WB entered into a Credit Agreement to finance the project. The Government of Nigeria has secured **US\$115 million**, with the WB contributing **\$75 million** and the AFD providing **\$40 million** for the 17 ACE Impact Centres and the National ACE Project domiciled at the National Universities Commission. Whereas, the University of Lagos is responsible to build capacity within West Africa's Tertiary Educational System for

implementing high quality training and applied research. Hence, the World Bank had approved the sum of \$959,473.00 (N413,532,863) for the the proposed project for the Construction of Africa Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) at the University.

d) The University forwarded Performance and Funding Agreement between the National Universities Commission and University of Lagos as evidence of Funding from World Bank Support Fund through the International Development Association (IDA).

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- e) The University expressed concern that adopting Open Competitive Bidding Process could delay the project target and the fund could be taken back by the World Bank due to lack of fund utilization by the Centre. The University explained that the project is result based; hence, money can only be earned when Disbursement Link Indicators (DLIs) are met and achieved and the World Bank may decline further funding of the project if the Centre is not meeting the DLI for which the project was conceived. Therefore, adopting Selective Tendering Method of Procurement is more appropriate in this circumstance. Considering the essence of time and the scheduled visit by the World Bank to the Centre in January 2023 and the specialized nature of the project, the University reasoned that adopting Open Competitive Bidding at this point will be counter-productive and may automatically lead to risk of withdrawing the money earmarked for the project by the World Bank.
- 4. Considering that the project is a WB sponsored and funded by it_z the Bureau reasoned that the University should seek and obtain the requisite approval from the WB for the implementation and execution of the contract.
- 5. In view of the above, Due Process "No Objection" can be granted to University of Lagos to adopt Selective Tendering Method of Procurement for the Construction of Africa Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) Centre Building.

6. The University of Lagos should:

- a) Issue the relevant standard bidding document (SBD) to the shortlisted firms to bid for the procurement based on the specification and evaluation criteria in the SBD in order to enhance Transparency and Accountability:
- b) Ensure that only Financial Competitive will form the basis of selecting the responsive bidder in line with Section 33(1) of the Public Procurement Act, 2007 so that the Government can have value for money:
- c) Be guided by the approval Threshold stipulated in SGF. Circular Ref. No. SGF/OP/I/S JNIII/57 dated 11th March, 2009 and the revised Circular Ref. No. SGF/OP/I/S .3/XI /849 dated 14th March. 2016 in approving the projects.
- d.) Conduct Due Diligence /Post Qualification in line with the resolution of the Federal Executive Council's (FEC) meeting held on May 17,2017 and SGF Circular Ref. No. SGF/50/5.52/III /652 dated October 11. 2017 on the recommended companies in Lot 2. The Due Diligence report should include but not limited to:
 - i. Names of the Directors of the Company:
 - ii. Professional and Technical qualifications of the Personnel required to carry out the procurement;
 - iii. Financial Capacity:
 - iv. Equipment and any other relevant infrastructure;

- v. Verification of adequate Personnel to perform the obligations of the procurement contract;
- vi. Possesses the legal capacity to enter into contract with the Federal Government;
- vii. Not in receivership subjects of any forms of insolvency or bankruptcy proceedings or the subject of any form or winding up petition or proceedings;
- viii. Having fulfilled all the obligation with regards to payment of taxes, pensions and social security contributions;
- ix. Not have any Director who has been convicted in any Country for criminal offence relating to fraud or financial impropriety or criminal misrepresentation or falsification of facts relating to any matter.

1.0 Introduction

1.1 Background

The **ACEDHARS**, University of Lagos is desirous of Constructing a befitting Centre Building with a view to achieving its aim which is to build capacity within West Africa Tertiary Educational System for implementing high quality training and applied research

1.2 Project Location

The project is to be located at the Main Campus of the University of Lagos, Akoka Lagos.

1.3 Project Description and Scope of Works

The project can be described as the Proposed Construction of ACEDHARS Centre Building. It involves preliminary works, main building electrical & mechanical installation and external works.

1.4 Source of Funding

The source of funding is drawn from the ACE World Bank Project

2.0 Procurement Plan

The Centre carried out the procurement plan prior to the tendering process by ascertaining the need for the project, determining availability of funds and integrated the funds into its yearly budget. It also decided the procurement method to be used; the approving authority based on the monetary threshold, the criteria for evaluation and subsequently set up a Technical Evaluation Sub-Committee for that purpose.

2.1 Procurement Process

The Centre through a letter dated November 21, 2022 requested for Due Process "No Objection" to adopt Restricted Tendering Method in selecting contractors for the Proposed Construction of ACEDHARS Centre Building from the Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP).

The Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP) by a letter dated December 21,2022 (Copy of letter attached and marked "Appendix A) granted the request of the University Due Process "No Objection" to adopt Restricted Tendering Method for the Proposed Construction of ACEDHARS Centre Building from the Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP) in favour of:

- 2. Giohen Global Concepts Limited
- 3. Integrated Engineering Projects Limited
- 4. Maicat Nigeria Limited

2.2 Collection of Standard Bidding Document

The bidders were invited to pick up Standard Bidding Document through a letter dated December 23, 2022 (copy of letter attached and marked "Appendix B").



- 3.4 In view of the above, the Tenders Board is required to ratify the award of Contract for Supply of Examination Materials made in favour of UNILAG Press & Bookshop in the sum of Thirty-Six Million, Three Hundred and Eighty-One Thousand, Nine Hundred and Seventy-Seven Niara and Fifty kobo (N36,381,977.50)

4.0 Construction of ACEDHARS Centre Building

- 4.1 The ACEDHARS, University of Lagos is desirous of Constructing a befitting Centre Building with a view to achieving its aim which is to build capacity within West Africa Tertiary Educational System for implementing high quality training and applied research. The source of funding is drawn ACE World Bank Project
- 4.2 The Centre through a letter dated November 21, 2022 requested for Due Process "No Objection" to adopt Restricted Tendering Method in selecting contractors for the Proposed Construction of ACEDHARS Centre Building from the Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP). The Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP) by a letter dated December 21, 2022 (Copy of letter attached and marked "Appendix B) granted the request of the University Due Process "No Objection" to adopt Restricted Tendering Method for the Proposed Construction of ACEDHARS Centre Building in favour of:

 - 2. Giohen Global Concepts Limited
 - 3. Integrated Engineering Projects Limited
 - 4. Maicat Nigeria Limited
