REPORT ON THE AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF SAMPLE S PREPARATION EQUIPMENT LOT 2 FOR ACEDHARS

1.0 Introduction

1.1 Background

The **ACEDHARS**, University of Lagos is desirous of procuring laboratory equipment (Sample Preparation Equipment) Centre with a view to achieving its aim which is to build capacity within West Africa Tertiary Educational System for implementing high quality training and applied research

1.2 Project Location

The project is to be located at the Centres Laboratory in the University of Lagos.

1.3 Project Description and Scope of Works

The project can be described as the Procurement of Sample Preparation Equipment.

1.4 Source of Funding

The source of funding is drawn from the ACE World Bank Project

2.0 Procurement Plan

The Centre carried out the procurement plan prior to the tendering process by ascertaining the need for the project, determining availability of funds and integrated the funds into its yearly budget. It also decided the procurement method to be used; the approving authority based on the monetary threshold, the criteria for evaluation and subsequently set up a Technical Evaluation Sub-Committee for that purpose.

2.1 Procurement Process

The Centre through a letter dated September 27, 2022 requested for Due Process "No Objection" to adopt Restricted Tendering Method in selecting suppliers for the Procurement of Laboratory Equipment from the Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP).

The Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP) by a letter dated November 10, 2022 (Copy of letter attached and marked "Appendix A) advised the University to invite five responsive companies with cognate experience to bid for the Procurement of Samples Equipment.

2.2 Collection of Standard Bidding Document

The Centre invited the under-listed bidders to pick up Standard Bidding Document through a letter dated November 30, 2022 (copy of letter attached and marked "Appendix B").

3.0 Financial Bid Opening

The bid was opened at Room 216 Department of Botany Faculty of Science, University of Lagos, Akoka, Yaba, Lagos on December 16, 2022 in the presence of representatives of the bidders and Staff members from the University of Lagos (copy of Attendance attached and marked "Appendix C").

The prices of the bidders as shown in Table 1 below were announced publicly. The Financial Bid Form duly signed by representative of the Bidders is attached and marked ("Appendix D").

No.: PROC/OSGF/BPP/709/85 dated 19th January, 2022 issued by the Secretary to the Federal Government on the Approval for the Revision of the Subsisting Service - Wide Prior Review Thresholds and Monetary Threshold, the University hereby request for the Parastal Tenders Board approval for the award Procurement of Samples Preparation Equipment (LOT2) for ACEDHARS be made in favour of Afrilab Investment Limited in the sum of Ninety- Eight Million, Nine Hundred and Thirty-One Thousand, Twenty- Eight Naira and Eighty- Five Kobo (N98,931,028.85) only for a duration of Eight (8) Weeks.

REQUEST FOR CERTIFICATE OF "NO OBJECTION" TO ADOPT SELECTIVE TENDERING FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF SPECIALIZED LABORATORY EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLE FOR THE UNIVERSITY'S WORLD BANK SPONSORED SECOND AFRICA HIGHER EDUCATION CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE FOR DEVELOPMENT IMPACT (ACE-IMPACT) PROJECT.

This is to acknowledge the receipt of the University of Lagos' (UNILAG) letter with Ref. No. VC/AD/ACE/200 dated September 27, 2022 requesting the Bureau to grant Due Process "No Objection" to adopt Restricted/Selective Tendering Method of Procurement to Procure Specialized Laboratory Equipment and Vehicle for the University's World Bank Sponsored Second Africa Higher Education Centre of Excellence for Development Impact (ACE-IMPACT) Project as shown in Table 1 below.

- 2. In the letter of September 27, 2022 under reference, the University of Lagos (UNILAG) stated as replicated below:
 - a. "Background: The Africa Center of Excellence (ACE 1) Project was instituted in 2013 by the Governments of Nigeria, Ghana, Benin Republic, Togo, Burkina Faso, Cameroun and Senegal with support from the World Bank, to promote regional specialization amongst participating universities in the West and Central Africa sub-region within disciplines that

However, the 2nd Africa Higher Education Center of Excellence (ACE IMPACT) Project was lunched to consolidate on the gains of ACE 1, and it saw the emergence of new players like Niger, Guinea and Togo (all from West Africa) and Djibouti (from East Africa). The objectives of ACE Impact included to improve on the quantity of students enrolled in postgraduate programmes and improve on the quality of postgraduate programmes such that students can acquire the necessary theoretical knowledge and applied skills upon graduating. The project also aimed at improving the development impact of postgraduate education in selected universities, through regional specification, such that the knowledge from research and skills acquired by graduates will be able to directly address the development challenges in the regions;

- b. The Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) and the International Development Agency (IDA) of the World Bank (WB) entered into a credit agreement (Credit Number 6510NG) to finance the ACE Impact project. To implement the project, the Government of Nigeria has secured US\$115 million, with the World Bank contributing \$75 million and the French Development Agency (AFD) providing \$40 million for the 17 ACE Impact Centres and the NUC;
- c. The National ACE Project Coordination Unit (NAPCU) domiciled at the National Universities Commission (NUC) is responsible for the national project facilitation, training, and supervision in fiduciary aspects as well as national Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) and minor Technical Assistance (TA) in Nigeria;
- d. To this end, the Africa Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS), domiciled at the University of Lagos, Lagos State is responsible to build capacity within West Africa's tertiary educational system for implementing high quality training and applied research;
- e. World Bank Funded Project: 1\$ Equal to N414: The World Bank had approved the sum of \$469,000.00 (#197,486,520) for the purchase of new Laboratory/Research Equipment and \$75.559.19 (#31,281,426.00) for the purchase of project vehicle. Furthermore, it is imperative to add that the World Bank will be coming for Mid Term review Visitation/Inspection and commissioning of the project laboratory in November, 2022 and it is expected that the new equipment and should be in place before the scheduled Visit. This also will enable the Centre commence teaching activities for the 2021/2022 batch of students admitted by the African Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) at the University. The allocated laboratory space for the ACEDHARS project funded by the World Bank is presently not conducive and adequately equipped to carry out research and teaching activities due to the growing activities of the project and thus, need to be well equipped to accommodate the increasing number of students' intake and research work. The equipment and the project vehicle which forms part of the entire ACEDHARS project would alleviate the shortages currently affecting the growth and objectives of the establishment of the Centre and would boost excellence in ACEDHARS at the Centre and the country in general;
- f. Justification for Selective Tendering/Direct Sourcing from Manufacturers: Considering the essence of time in these procurement in which if advertised could cause delay and the fund could be taken back by the sponsor (World Bank) due to lack of fund utilization by the Centre, the University wishes to adopt the selective tendering method in engaging competent vendors to execute these projects.
- g. Given the fact that the project is result based, hence money can only be earned when disbursement Link Indicators (DLIs) are met and achieved, the World Bank may decline further funding of the project if the Centre is not meeting the Disbursement Linked Indicators (DLI) for which the project was conceived. Therefore, it has become imperative to adopt the Selective Tendering procedure for the University to meet the DLI and in line with the provision of Section 40(b&C) of the Public Procurement Act 2007.

h. Also, due to the COVID 19 Pandemic which has been ravaging the world over thus, gathering of persons and representatives of companies to the bid opening exercise would

not be a good idea if we must avoid close contact.

i. Considering the time scheduled for the World Bank's Mid Term review visit in November, 2022 to the Centre, and the specialized nature of this procurement, adopting open competitive tendering at this point will be counter-productive to the center and may automatically lead to risk of withdrawing the money earmarked for this procurement by the World Bank. For these reasons, the University is appealing to you to use your good office to approve the adoption of selective tendering method for the procurement of specialized research equipment and vehicle as an exception rather than the norm in line with the provision of section 40 1(c) of the public procurement act 2007 using the original Equipment Manufacturer Authorized representatives.

j. The Project will be funded from World Bank Support Fund. Attached is the Performance and Funding Agreement between the National Universities Commission and University of

Lagos with funding from the International Development Association (IDA).

k. Knowledge and Cognate Experience: It is imperative that competent firms with cognate experience and good track records are chosen. The shortlisted companies are representatives of equipment manufacturers in Nigeria to be engaged to deliver in terms of quality and timing while also offering competitive price so as to obtain value for money. The University has identified some companies that have previous business with Federal Government of Nigeria which provides the advantage of having adequate knowledge of the assignment and has proven speedy completion of the projects while ensuring quality. The companies that meet up with the requirement of the provisions of section 16(6)(d) of the PPA, 2007 that can do business with Federal Government of Nigeria to effectively carry out the implementation of these projects are as detailed below.

- I. Proposal and Profile: Please find attached profiles of the companies upon which Certificate of "No Objection" for Selective Tendering is sought alongside the following supporting documents for ease of reference:
 - Memorandum of Understanding between National Universities Commission (NUC) and Federal University of Lagos;
 - The Center's approved and cleared work plan and procurement plan;
 - The Funding/Loan Agreement; and
 - Project Appraisal Document (PAD)."
- The Bureau has carefully reviewed the UNILAG's request of September 3. 27, 2022 and noted that the UNILAG intends to procure 4No. Projects for African

Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) through the adoption of Selective Tendering Method of Procurement.

- 4. The attention of the UNILAG is drawn note to the conditions which govern Special and Restricted Method of Procurement as stipulated under Section 40(1) of the Public Procurement Act (PPA), 2007, states that: a procuring entity may for reasons of economy and efficiency engage in procurement by means of Restricted Tendering Method of Procurement. The applicable relevant clauses are as follows:
 - (a) the goods, works or services are available only from a limited number of suppliers or contractors;
 - (b) the time and cost required to examine and evaluate a large number of tenders is disproportionate to the value of the goods, works or services to be procured; or
 - (c) The procedure is used as an exception rather than norm.
- 5. Considering the directive of the SGF's Circular with Ref. No. SGF.OP/I/S.3/VIII/250 dated April 12, 2011 that locally assembled vehicle manufacturers be patronized instead of foreign vehicles where there are close substitutes and bearing in mind Section 40(1)(a) of the PPA, 2007 the request of the UNILAG satisfies the conditions for the adoption of **Selective Tendering Procurement Method** for the procurement of 18-seater bus;
- 6. Furthermore, bearing in mind the Federal Government Policy and Strategy of engaging only OEM/Authorised Representatives, in which MDAs are requested to procure equipment from OEM/Authorised Representatives that will provide the requisite guarantees and after sales maintenance services from operation of the equipment, the request of the University for the adoption of **Selective Tendering Procurement Method** for the procurement of Lots 1, 2 and 3 can be considered in line with the Federal Government Policy on Procurement of Equipment from Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM).
- 7. The University furthermore stated that the reason for the request to adopt Selective Tendering Procurement Method is due to the scheduled World Bank's Mid Term review visit in November, 2022 to the Centre, and the specialized nature of the procurements whereby adopting open competitive tendering at this point will be counter-productive and may automatically lead to risk of withdrawing the money earmarked for this procurement by the World Bank.
- 8. A search in the Bureau's Database shows that the UNILAG has not uploaded its 2022 Procurement Plans and 2021 Procurement Records using the Nigeria Open Contracting Portal (NOCOPO) accessible on the Bureau's website www.bpp.gov.ng (nocopo.bpp.gov.ng) in line with the directive in the SGF's

Circular with Ref. No. PROC/OSGF/BPP/709/89 dated 19th January 2022. The UNILAG should therefore without further delay, upload the required documents accordingly.

- 9. The UNILAG stated that they solicited and obtained company profiles for the Project for African Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) and forwarded profiles for only Lots 1 and 3 to the Bureau and did not evaluate the company profiles. The University did not forward the company profiles for Lots 2 and 4.
- 10. The above notwithstanding, the Bureau subjected the profiles of the companies to independent review to confirm and ensure that the companies meet all the eligibility responsive requirements as stipulated in Section 16(6) of the Public Procurement Act, 2007 and SGF's Circular No. SGF/50/S.52/II dated 11th December, 2014. The SGF's Circular referred to above states that only firms that have registered in the Bureau's National Database for Registration, Categorization and Classification of Federal Contractors, Consultants and Service Providers with evidence of Interim Registration Report (IRR) issued by the Bureau are qualified to do Federal Government Contracts. The outcome of the Bureau's review is as shown in Table 10 below.

- 11. Arising from the outcome of Bureau's Independent evaluation of the UNILAG's submission, it was discovered that:
 - a. Company profiles for Lots 2 and 4 were not forwarded to the Bureau for review. Consequently, the UNILAG should invite minimum of five (5)

- unrelated responsive companies with cognate experience to bid for each of the Lots;
- b. All the shortlisted companies in Lot 1 and 3 are responsive to the eligibility/mandatory criteria as stipulated in Section 16 (6) of the Public Procurement Act (PPA), 2007, and can proceed to the financial stage of the procurement process.
- 12. The University of Lagos (UNILAG) attached a photocopy of an extract of the World Bank ACE Grant in the sum of \$469,000.00 (\Re 197,486,520) for the purchase of new Laboratory/Research Equipment and \$75,559.19 (\Re 31,281,426.00) for the purchase of project vehicle as evidence of source of funding for the projects.
- 13. In view of the foregoing Due Process "No Objection" **cannot be** granted to the University of Lagos (UNILAG) to adopt Restricted/Selective tendering Method to procure Laboratory/Research Equipment and project vehicle for African Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) as requested.
- 14. However, On the strength of the submissions by the UNILAG and on the ground that the procedure is used as an exception rather than norm in line with Section 40(1)(c) of the Public Procurement Act (PPA), 2007 Due Process "No Objection" can be granted to the University of Lagos (UNILAG) to adopt Restricted /Selective tendering Method to procure Laboratory/Research Equipment and project vehicle for African Centre of Excellence for Drug Research, Herbal Medicine Development and Regulatory Science (ACEDHARS) in favour of the company in Table 14 below.



INTROTRODUCTION

This Tender Document for the Procurement of Goods has the following contents:

IFT Invitation for Tender (IFT): This is a repeat of the IFT which was published in the media and on the website of the Procuring Entity announcing the Tender and providing the essential information to prospective Tenderers to invite

them to participate. It is reprinted here for reference purposes only

Instructions to Tenderers (ITT): The ITT are standardinstructions which guidethe Tenderers how to prepare their tenders. Standard instructions mean that they cannot be modified by the Procuring Entity. The ITT are based on the Procurement Law and the Regulations for Goods and Works, from which the procedures for tender submission, opening, evaluation and Contract award have been derived. They clarify the general evaluation criteria for the selection of the lowest evaluated responsive tenderer and describe the basic qualifications of the Tenderer needed for contract execution. This Section

cannot be changed under any circumstances.

Special Instructions to Tenderers (SIT). In this Section the Procuring Entity supplements or adapts the relevant clauses of the ITT to the specific tender information or project requirements where needed (name of the Procuring Entity, tender submission date, specific evaluation criteria, amount of tender security, tender validity period, alternative tenders permitted or not, fixed price contract or contract subject to price adjustment, goods delivery schedule, domestic preference applies or not, level of performance security to be provided at contract signature, etc Modifications to the Instructions to Tenderers using special Instructions to Tender to make them more specific

cannot change the Law or the Regulations.
